Does your vision for Morningside neighborhood's future include any of these opportunities? (*Check any.*)

5 Preservation of the neighborhood's historic character:

- Not necessarily HISTORIC, but rather, closer knit small neighborhood.
- Which part of history? Perhaps develop and retain some "period" agriculture sites (orchards, pastures, gardens)
- Not a lot of history
- Preserve a building or two of Fairview

9 New stores, restaurants, services and cultural offerings in the neighborhood:

- No retail near I-5. Don't want to see a repeat of other interchanges – Woodburn, Kaiser....!
- Restaurants
- Restaurants, cafes, shops so people can walk or bike to nearby businesses.
- Mostly keeping buildings occupied so they don't become attractions for crime.
- Trader Joe's, more dining facilities.
- Limit strip mall development; stress redevelopment of existing vacant structures to more current service demands.
- Neighborhood scale services

13 Sidewalks, bike lanes, better transit to support pedestrian, bicycle and alternative travel:

- Better walking / biking from neighborhood to Fairview Industrial area – need bikeway, sidewalks on Reed!
- Maybe a street that is mixed car / bike use (kind of like Saginaw); railroad bike / pedestrian path
- Make it easier and safer for children to walk or bike to school
- Pringle, North of Madrona, could use the illegal open ditches for wide sidewalks, bike lanes and bus pull-overs.
- Increase bicycle lanes and trails
- Time to push for complete sidewalks in residential streets and at least one side of main arterials; "enhance connectivity"
- Much of Morningside has no sidewalks; need connectivity to bike paths

- Crosswalk across Pringle to Leslie Middle School fields
- North Morningside (because of its development history) lacks curbs and sidewalks.
- Some more sidewalks, more bike lines.

8 Public access to streams and protections for trees, streams and other natural resources:

- Maintain diversity of vegetation as it also supports a variety of wildlife.
- Keep green areas adjacent to and along all waterways.
- Should emphasize remote viewing of natural / resource sites rather than physical access; Trees need to be promoted and care for them properly in the landscape. However, we should make sure ordinance and authorities are not perceived as intrusive on property owners' rights.
- Linear park bike route along Pringle Creek
- Plant trees along street – improve beauty of neighborhood.

5 An updated industrial district and more jobs:

- Job opportunities close to residential areas so employees can walk or bike to work, or have a short commute.
- Salvage what we have left with after loss of original industries.
- No Fairview is adequate

5 More homes and contemporary housing types:

- Full development of the Fairview Sustainable area with 1-story, 0-lot line homes for seniors who wish to downsize. (Duplexes, but owner occupied.)
- I would like to see more quality (not necessarily large) single family, owner-occupied homes rather than cheap rentals and apartment complexes. Limit in-filling - subdividing properties less than 1 acre to more than 2 or 3 lots
- Yes – Fairview, etc.
- Fix up existing homes not more new homes.

11 Parks, open space and recreation opportunities for youth and families:

- Inviting nearby parks so children and families can play outdoors – increase physical activity and health.
- A bit more secure bicycle routes; maybe a community garden.
- Destination opportunities in parks; walkable neighborhood parks as well as regional parks.
- Make sure “recreation” (sports) opportunities include ample off-street parking.

- Regional park at Reservoir site
- Update Morningside Park play equipment; loose leash dog park
- Always necessary to keep the City's feet to the fire on these – help to volunteer upkeep.
- We walk our neighborhood and would like to see more open spaces and neighborhood parks.

6 Strong, successful neighborhood schools:

- The foundation of a vibrant, healthy city, state and nation.
- Need a new high school and why not in Kuebler I-5 Interchange area? How about a sports park – similar to Wallace Marine with ball fields and spectator accommodations.
- Upgrade teachers
- Safe routes to schools
- Please!
- Establish a Charter School; new High School

8 Community infrastructure: water, sewer, stormwater, streets, streetlights:

- Streetlights so it is safe to walk at night.
- More sidewalks; sustainable living
- Keep up efforts to use permeable paving, bio swales, etc.; New street lights should be more energy efficient – maybe even solar power enhanced?
- Bio swales
- Street lights along Battle Creek
- See sidewalks.

3 Community services:

- Emergency services for disasters.
- Lodging – more needed; small conference center?
- Neighborhood watch

- Focus on making retail on Commercial and 12/13th Street successful rather than new retail. Need better walking / bike access to retail on Commercial. Need to be able to safely walk to

retail. Need dedicated bikeway to downtown. Upgrade Reed to City / urban standards. Need café /food in Fairview industrial area so we don't need to drive from work to lunch.

- Seriously, we need a bike / pedestrian path to downtown. I would like to help with this if needed.
- Upgrade the railroad crossing at McGilchrist and Madrona to meet "Quiet Zone" requirements so trains do not need to blow their horns – this would enhance the livability of Morningside as well as other more distant neighborhoods.

- Should create a right turn lane / refuge – a long one – turning East off Pringle – onto McGilchrist to allow for rail x-ing wait. Likewise, wide bike lanes on both sides of McGilchrist would allow bike travel all the way to say Walmart and Lowes.
